

SPEEDWATCH

Report to Parish Council 17th January 2019

We are still running as many sessions as possible with the operators available.

During November we ran 14 sessions, totalling 16 hours, that recorded 67 vehicles from 3150 vehicles that passed during the sessions (2.4%) 1 vehicle failed the DVLA check, one was shown to have no tax and/or MOT, fastest recorded during the sessions was 46mph. 5 sessions were cancelled due to various reasons.

During December we ran 12 sessions, totalling 10 hours, that recorded 39 vehicles from 1875 vehicles that passed during the sessions (2.5%), one vehicle failed the DVLA check due to a colour input error, Fastest was 46mph, 3 sessions had to be cancelled.

From January 14th -27th the National Police Chief's Council (NPCC) is running a Speed campaign, Police Forces and road safety organisations across the UK will be running many high profile speed checks. Speedwatch groups have not been asked to do anything specific during the two weeks, apart from continuing to run as many session as possible with available operators.

The NPCC was formed in 2015 and replaced the Association of Chief Police Officers (ACPO).
